A 21 DAY PRAYER AND FASTING PROGRAM TO STIR UP INDIVIDUAL REVIVAL

Theme Scripture: *"But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us."* — 2 Corinthians 4:7

Introduction:

Welcome to **"Oh God, Stir Up the Treasure in Me"** 21-Day Fasting and Prayer Program. An intentional journey designed to awaken the divine treasure God has deposited within you. This program is designed to push us towards personal revival, deep encounter with God and in partnership with the Holy Spirit, to push us unto new levels in Christ.

Over the next 21 days, you will be guided through prayers, declarations, and reflections aimed at aligning your heart fully with God's will. This journey is not just about spiritual discipline but about transformation, steering up the precious treasure inside you so that your life becomes a testimony of God's goodness, power, and calling.

As you fast and pray, expect God to reveal who you truly are in Him. Embrace this season with an open heart and a willing spirit, knowing that you are being prepared and equipped to be a blessing and a light to the world. Let this time ignite a holy hunger to walk boldly in the fullness of your destiny.

Why This Program? A Call to Deeper Prayer and Intimacy

In recent times, I've observed a troubling trend among many sincere Christians: an abundance of noise, fervor, and emotional intensity in prayer, yet a painful emptiness in depth. Under the tutelage of countless voices, many well-meaning, we have become expert prayer warriors for our needs and wants. The testimonies we chase are often tied more to convenience and comfort than to consecration. Though not inherently wrong, our pursuit of results has become addictive, almost intoxicating.

We have grown louder, but not deeper.

We have grown busier, but not more intimate with God.

We have pages of prayer points, yet few chapters of Scripture opened.

We are stirred in emotion but weak in revelation.

And in the midst of it all, I sense the Father asking:

"Do you truly want to pray according to My will... or are you just shouting into the wind?"

This program was birthed out of a burden, one that comes from the Spirit gently drawing us back to the secret place. It's an invitation to dig deeper, not wider. To rediscover what it means to tarry in His presence. To return to the kind of prayer that is not driven by fear or demand, but by love, surrender, and alignment with God's heart.

Let's read the following 2 biblical narratives that resonate and bear witness to the fact that it is important to be at that place of alertness in the spirit with the word of God being our focus.

Mary vs. Martha (Luke 10:38-42)

When Jesus visited the home of Martha and Mary, Martha was distracted by much serving, just like many of us are distracted by "much praying." But Mary sat at Jesus' feet, listening, still, intentional, present. And Jesus said:

"Martha, Martha, you are worried and troubled about many things. But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her."

This is the essence of our call in this season. To choose the "good part." To sit. To hear. To become students of His heart.

The Testimony of Ezra (Ezra 7:10)

Ezra was a priest and scribe, and the Bible gives us a clear insight into why God's hand was so strong upon him: *"For Ezra had prepared his heart to seek the law of the Lord, and to do it, and to teach in Israel statutes and judgments."* — Ezra 7:10

He dug deep into the Word, lived it out, and then taught it. That's the kind of vessel God uses, those who seek not just to be filled, but to be transformed and then to transform others.

Without having a conscious desire to remain in God's word and pray in accordance with His will, not our own superfluous will, all the time we will end up being like soundless gongs.

Why Now?

Because we are raising a generation that knows how to scream in prayer, but not how to listen in stillness. Because God is not impressed by volume, but by alignment. Because our nation and our families need spiritual accuracy, not just activity. Because the Word of God must once again become our foundation in prayer, not our last resort when emotions fail.

This Program Is for You, If:

- You desire a deeper, more authentic relationship with God
- You are tired of shallow routines and hunger for spiritual substance
- You want to hear God clearly and pray prayers that touch heaven
- You are ready to align your will with God's will
- You are ready to trade noise for nourishment, and chaos for communion

Program Vision:

To awaken, ignite, and empower individuals to seek a deeper walk with God, discover their divine identity, and release the hidden treasures of grace, gifts, and purpose placed within them, becoming carriers of God's glory to the nations.

Format:

This is an immersive prayer program and it is important that you make it yours as led by the Holy Spirit. However, we shall all be fasting corporately to ensure that we are light enough for this journey. Expected daily activities are as follows:

1. **Bible Reading:** it is expected that **we shall read the books of Mathew, Luke, Acts and Galatians** for the entire 21 days duration. Please take time to read these 2 books and take notes as led by the Holy Spirit. These shall also be the focus books for our prayers and meditations.
2. **Midnight prayers:** It is expected that we shall take time to pray at midnight at least 14 out of the 21 days. Midnight prayers are intense and effectual. Lets try to make sacrifices to wake up for those minimum number of days. Choose the dates you wish to pray at midnight and mark those dates on your diaries. However, if you are embarking on the Esther Fast, I will encourage you to pray at midnight throughout that period.

3. **Fasting:** It is expected that we shall fast through-out this journey using the Easter and Daniel Fasting Model as outlined below, unless you cannot for whatever reason and you have found peace regarding this decision, please do fast. It will keep you totally alert. And if you cannot fast, please just eat very light meals and stay away from meals that will clog your digestive system.
4. **Giving to the Poor/Ophans and Widows:** It is expected that we shall remember the poor, the orphans and the widows **throughout this fasting period** in line with the word of God. **Isa.58:6-7**. Take time to give out gifts especially to those that need them.
5. **Listen to the Holy Spirit & Journal Intentionally:** One of the most powerful yet often neglected disciplines in the life of a believer is listening. In our prayer and Bible study routines, we tend to do most of the talking, praying, declaring, asking, while giving very little room for the Holy Spirit to speak back. But God is still speaking, and He desires to commune with us daily. As you read the Word and pray, pause intentionally. Make room in the silence for the voice of the Holy Spirit. He will give instructions, stir convictions, release wisdom, and reveal direction, but only if you are listening with the ears of your heart.

Just as the prophets recorded visions, and the psalmists penned their cries, you are encouraged to journal your journey. Your journal becomes a prophetic archive, a reference point to revisit what God has said and a record of how He is leading you forward. It will help you track your growth, obey divine nudges, and document spiritual insights.

Reflective Questions for Your Journaling Time:

As you study the Word and listen, consider writing thoughtful responses to the following questions:

- a) What is God personally saying to me through this scripture or moment?
- b) What lessons is He teaching me? What am I being corrected, challenged, or encouraged about?
- c) What clear action steps or obedience points is He highlighting?
- d) How can I practically apply this truth to my current season, relationships, or assignment?
- e) In what ways must I grow in spiritual responsibility and accountability regarding this Word?

- f) Is there a project, burden, or new direction God is stirring in my heart?
- g) How can I live more intentionally so that my life becomes a blessing to others?
- h) How can I align my gifts, talents, and experiences with God's purpose in this season?
- i) Who can I serve, disciple, or help to encounter God more tangibly through my life?

Ref Scriptures:

- *"Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening."*: **1 Samuel 3:10**
- *"He awakens me morning by morning, wakens my ear to listen like one being instructed."*: **Isaiah 50:4**
- *"Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so he may run who reads it."*: **Habakkuk 2:2**
- *"The Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, will teach you all things and remind you of everything I have told you."*: **John 14:26**

Let this not be just a season of seeking, but also a season of hearing, remembering, and responding. God is speaking. Are you ready to listen and record what He says?

6. **Pray Fervently:** Do not rush the prayers. Spend time on each prayer point and take all the declarations seriously.

TiEV's Recommended Way of Starting and Ending Prayers

1. When Starting Prayers:

As you prepare to enter each prayer session, **come with a heart full of expectation**. You are not just saying words, you are stepping into a divine appointment. The Father has been waiting for this moment with you. *"Draw near to God, and He will draw near to you"* (James 4:8).

Begin by **acknowledging His presence**, worship Him, asking for forgiveness for all sins (both known and unknown), exalt His name, and welcome the Holy Spirit. Let your soul be still, for **the Lord is in His holy temple** (Habakkuk 2:20). Whisper your love for Him. Speak of His goodness. Adore Him from the depths of your soul.

Then, begin to **pray in the Spirit**, let the rivers of living water flow out of your innermost being (John 7:38). As you speak in tongues, you are:

- **Building up your inner man (Jude 1:20)**
- **Praying mysteries only God understands (1 Corinthians 14:2)**
- **Stirring the atmosphere for divine encounters, even in your dreams**
- **Strengthening your spirit for the days ahead**

As you start, let this be your posture:

- **Open heart** – ready to be filled
- **Open hands** – ready to surrender
- **Open ears** – ready to hear

Ask the Lord to **sanctify the moments** and **sanctify your space**. Whether you're kneeling in your room, walking outside, or sitting with your journal, let your prayer moments become your personal altar raised to God.

When Ending Prayers & Just Before you Sleep:

As you bring your prayer time to a close each time (morning, afternoon or night) take a few moments to **thank God wholeheartedly**. Gratitude sets a seal on what He has done and opens the door for more. Remember, *“In everything give thanks, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you”* (1 Thessalonians 5:18).

Then, **yield yourself to the Holy Spirit** once again.

Let the Spirit help you **close by** sealing the prayers and preparing your soul to rest in God's presence. This is a powerful and peaceful way to end each prayer, spirit to spirit.

If it is nighttime, as you sleep, your spirit remains **alive and alert** to receive visions, dreams, instructions, and comfort from the Lord (Job 33:15–16).

FASTING SCHEDULE (21 DAYS)

Notes:

- Daniel Fast: Variant - Only Fruits and light spiced meals with no meat/chicken or fish for the 21 days. Eggs are allowed in this variant for Bulk
- Esther Fast: Dry Fast - With only Water and Holy Communion Morning and evening for only 3 days

Please check with your Doctor before you go on Esther Fast if you are not used to it and ensure that you are ready for it. If you are on any kind of medication, please kindly abstain and stick to Daniel Fast. If you are also not sure, you may continue with Daniel Fast throughout the 3 days of the Esther Fast and take light fruits and veggies.

When breaking your Esther fast, please start with warm water and fruits and then light meals such as pap until you feel strong enough to take any of the Daniel Fast Meals.

DAY 2: Reading - Matthew 4–5

Theme: *The Call and the Kingdom*

Prayer Focus: *Embracing God's Kingdom Values*

Devotional Reflection:

Jesus begins His public ministry with a decisive call: "Follow Me." This call came not only with an invitation but also with an expectation, a leaving behind. Matthew 4 shows us that following Jesus means abandoning familiar shores, personal ambitions, and worldly security to walk in obedience to His purpose.

In Matthew 5, Jesus unveils the values of the Kingdom of Heaven, radically different from worldly values. The *Sermon on the Mount* challenges us to live counter-culturally, embracing humility, purity, mercy, peacemaking, and righteousness, even when it costs us. This is not a call to comfort, but to spiritual transformation.

Consecration to Christ includes embracing the Kingdom lifestyle. God is not just calling us to *follow* Him, but to *become* like Him. To do this, our hearts must be reformed, our priorities reordered, and our lives reoriented to eternal values.

Journal Prompts:

- What is Jesus calling me to leave behind?
- How does the Sermon on the Mount challenge my current mindset?

DAY 3: Reading - Matthew 6–7

Theme: *Heart Matters*

Prayer Focus: *Authentic Righteousness and Trust in God*

Devotional Reflection:

In Matthew 6 and 7, Jesus turns our focus inward. While the world focuses on appearances, Christ zeroes in on the heart, the seat of motive, trust, and sincerity. He warns against public displays of righteousness that lack private intimacy with the Father. Prayer, giving, fasting, judgment, and even our speech must flow from hearts rightly aligned with God, not seeking man's praise.

At the core of this teaching is trust: trusting God in the hidden places, in provision, in justice, in prayer, and in obedience. Authentic righteousness flows from a place of secure trust in the Father's goodness. When we let go of public performance and religious pretense, we discover the beauty of true kingdom living, anchored in grace, not show.

Journal Prompts:

- Am I trusting God in secret and in public?
- What habits must I change to pursue God's approval over man's?

DAY 4: Reading - Matthew 8–9

Theme: *Faith and Compassion in Action*

Prayer Focus: *Trusting God's Power and Responding with Compassion*

Devotional Reflection:

In Matthew 8 and 9, we encounter a Savior whose authority is unmatched and whose compassion knows no limits. Jesus heals the sick, calms the storm, casts out demons, and forgives sins—proving that faith in Him is never misplaced. But alongside His power, we also see His heart: He touches the untouchable, sees the unseen, and moves toward the broken with tender compassion.

The centurion's faith stood out not because of status, but because of deep spiritual insight, he believed in the authority of Jesus' word. The hemorrhaging woman's quiet desperation touched the heart of God. The call of Matthew reminds us that mercy triumphs over judgment, and Jesus' final prayer is for laborers who will carry this same compassion into the world.
